

**NC Aquarium: Alice Hoffman Nature Trail** is a 0.7 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Atlantic Beach, North Carolina that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from March until October. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**NC Aquarium: Theodore Roosevelt Nature Trail** is a 1.3 mile lightly trafficked out and back trail located near Atlantic Beach, North Carolina that features a lake and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round.

**Fort Macon Beach Trail** is a 2.8 mile moderately trafficked out and back trail located near Atlantic Beach, North Carolina that offers scenic views and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from May until October.

**Ft. Macon: Elliot Coues Trail** is a 3.2 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Atlantic Beach, North Carolina that offers the chance to see wildlife and is rated as moderate. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, nature trips, and birding and is best used from April until September. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Fort Macon Nature Trail** is a 0.3 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Atlantic Beach, North Carolina that offers scenic views and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, nature trips, and birding and is best used from March until October.

**Emerald Isle Woods Trail** is a 0.9 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Emerald Isle, North Carolina that features a great forest setting and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, and trail running and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Patsy Pond Nature Trail Loop** is a 2.9 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located off Hwy 24 near Newport, North Carolina that offers the chance to see wildlife and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, nature trips, and birding and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Hammocks Beach Trail** is a 2.7 mile lightly trafficked out and back trail located near Hubert, North Carolina that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Track Trail at Hammocks Beach** is a 0.5 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Swansboro, North Carolina that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from April until September.

**Hubert Trail** is a 1.7 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Hubert, North Carolina that offers scenic views and is rated as moderate. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from April until September.

**Croatan National Forest - Cedar Point Trail** is a 1.5 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Swansboro, North Carolina that offers the chance to see wildlife and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, trail running, and nature trips and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Island Creek Forest Walk Trail** is a 3.7 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Pollocksville, North Carolina that features a river and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from March until October. Dogs are also able to use this trail.

**Weetock Trail** is a 18.7 mile moderately trafficked out and back trail located off NC 58 between Peletier and Maysville, North Carolina that features a river and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from April until October. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Neusiok Trail Southern Half** is a 12.9 mile moderately trafficked out and back trail accessed from Oyster Point Campground/Recreation Area near Newport, North Carolina that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, nature trips, and birding and is best used from April until October. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Neusiok Trail Northern Half** is a 22.6 mile lightly trafficked out and back trail access from Pine Cliff Recreation Area near Havelock, North Carolina that features a river and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail.

**Neusiok Trail: Beach Section** is a 3.3 mile lightly trafficked out and back trail located near Pine Cliff Recreation Area near Havelock, North Carolina that features a river. The trail is good for all skill levels and primarily used for hiking and walking. Dogs are also able to use this trail.

**Neusiok Trail** is a 20.6 mile moderately trafficked point-to-point trail located near Newport and Havelock, North Carolina that offers the chance to see wildlife and is rated as moderate. The trail offers a number of activity options and is best used from April until October. The two trail heads are at Pine Cliff Recreation Area and Oyster Point Campground/Recreation Area. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

**Piranha Pit Southern Half** is a 2.4 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Cherry Point, North Carolina that features a lake and is good for all skill levels.
